Naoyuki Agawa teaches American constitutional law and history at Doshisha University. From 1999-2016, he taught at Keio University and served as Minister for Public Affairs at the Embassy of Japan in Washington, D.C. He received his law degree from Georgetown University Law Center (1984) and graduated magna cum laude from the School of Foreign Service, Georgetown University (1977.) Among Agawa's books are *Manifest Destiny on the Seas? The Birth and Rise of Pax Americana* (2013.) He sits on the boards of the Suntory Foundation and the U.S.-Japan Council and is a member of CULCON, a panel that advises the governments of Japan and the U.S. on cultural and educational exchange matters.
